Bus Behaviour

Our staff are extremely proud of the positive behaviour that has been displayed by all students in the classroom and playground this year. Coolongolook Public School really is a great place to learn and the students really should be proud of their efforts.

Unfortunately, the same cannot be said about our students bus behaviour. This continues to cause concern and I am hoping to gain the support of all parents and carers to improve this area of our school. Currently, staff are working closely with Busways in identifying poor behaviour and assisting those students making poor choices in learning safe behaviours. Each afternoon, staff help in loading the bus, always seating students in the front five rows. No student is permitted past this designated point during morning or afternoon travel!

We have made it clear to all students that poor behaviour, which includes yelling, swearing, physical or verbal abuse or even moving seats will not be tolerated and will lead to consequences not only from the bus company, but also at school. With our current bus route, travelling along some of the most dangerous and concerning roads in our area, it is important for us all to take a lead role and ensure students arrive at school and home safely each and every day. We hope you can show your support and discuss the importance of your child's behaviour during this time.

Day for Daniel

On Friday October 25, students dressed in red in support of the 'Day for Daniel' campaign. During our morning session, both classes joined to discuss 'Stranger Danger' and how to keep safe when out and about. We hope our kids are never confronted with an uncomfortable situation but discussing preventative measures is crucial.
