Years 3–6 are enjoying working in their learning groups for both Literacy and Numeracy. This means individual support and focussed learning activities are provided in these Key Curriculum Areas. Our fantastic SLSO's Mrs Everingham, Mr Martyn (Jake) and Miss Thoroughgood also provide extra support individually and during group activities.

In History and Personal Development, students have been learning about 'Walking in Someone Else's Shoes'. This includes learning about a variety of disabilities and how it impacts upon people's daily lives. Empathy has been a focal point in many of these discussions. Students have been writing expositions about "Should People with Disabilities Get Special Help" and have been providing interesting arguments on why it is important to care for others. They have also been learning to use Auslan to spell their names.
